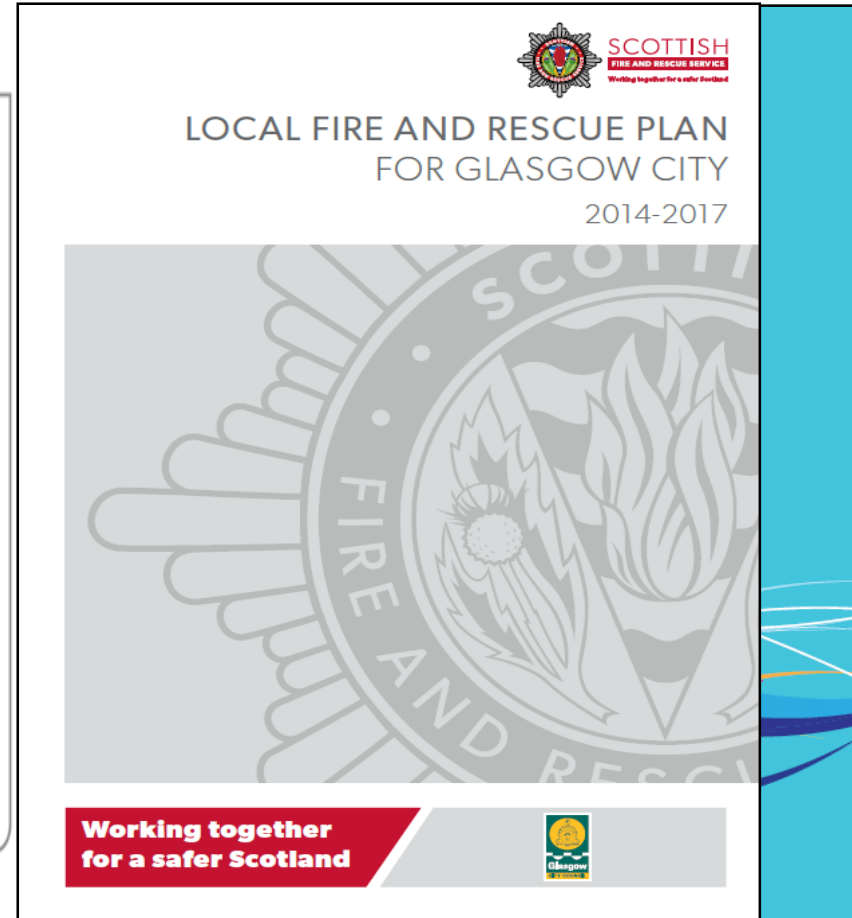
Local Assessment

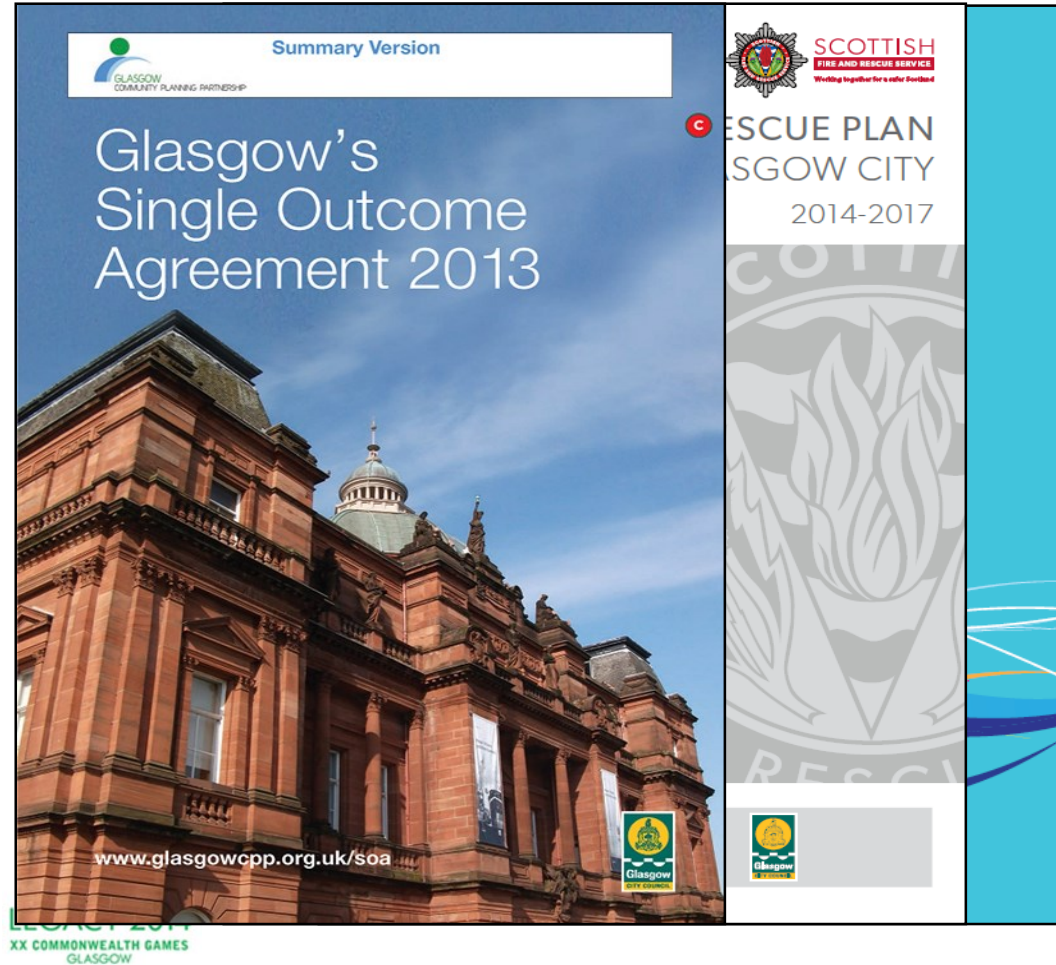

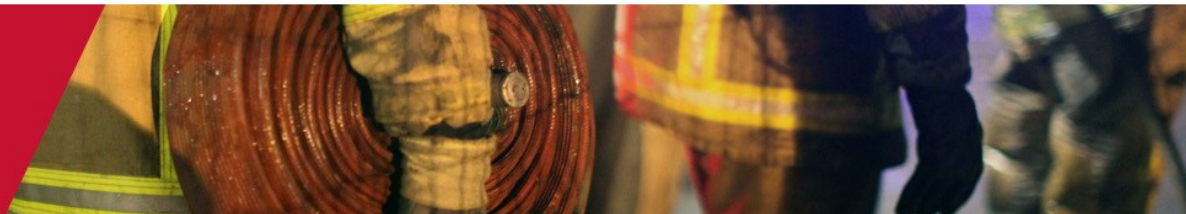

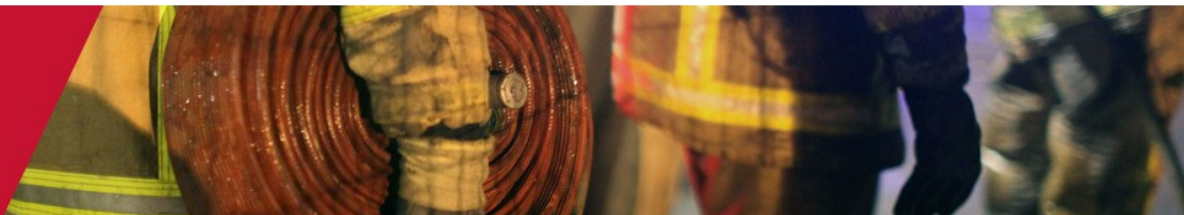
