"Hard to reach or Easy to Ignore?"

Equality & Human Rights Commission research into place based approaches, 2012 & 2015

- Evidence about equalities groups is missing
- Policy-makers don't understand the complexities of exclusion faced by equalities groups or how to tackle this.
- An assumption that everyone will benefit equally from placed based approaches
- Place-based policies can explicitly focus on equalities groups, but often in a negative way – for example disabled people as a group needing to gain employment to reduce welfare benefits expenditure.
- Place-based policies often fail to make sustained improvements in socioeconomic outcomes because the root cause of problems is outwith the neighbourhood, at the scale of the town, city or greater.
- But they COULD benefit disabled people who are concentrated in poorer areas- if efforts were made to include peeople


Case for Change

- Over 70% of members live in top 4 most deprived areas in Scotland- Over 50% in top 2
- Disabled people excluded by poverty, extra costs and cuts


Accessible means....

- Venue level access, accessible toilets plus level access ladies & gents, space++.
- **Timings** flexible, accommodation social care, stamina, cognition, etc.
- Transport essential for most disabled people, even for local meetings / events.
- Personal Assistance low-level & personal care.
- Communication Support BSL, ENTs, Pas, etc.
- Information MP3, Braille, large print, Electronic, videos BSL, etc.
- Equipment eg hoists, wheelchairs
